Dear Sir,

I would like to strongly object to Sita being granted a PCC license at Binn Farm.

For several years people in Abernethy have suffered foul smells from the existing tip area. Some days are much worse than others & sometimes ~~last for~~ for a short period & sometimes a longer period all depending on the wind.

As the prevailing wind is from the direction of the tip we are seriously worried about emissions from an incinerator as they would obviously come in the direction of Abernethy. What would happen if a fault occurred & it took hours to shut down the incinerator?

We were originally told we would not smell the tip - What about the problems from emissions? It may take years before a problem can be proved. It will be too late once the incinerator is built. The health risk from particulates from an incinerator are a real worry. Why should we suffer?

Due to an increase in rubbish from far away places (to make up the necessary 6000 tons of waste needed). There will be an increase in vehicle emissions & also rubbish spilled on the verges. Also more heavy lorries to contend with.

The price of houses will almost certainly be affected as visitors already notice foul smells.
